ORDINANCE NO. 344

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, DIVIDING THE CITY INTO FOUR (4) DISTRICTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COUNCILMEN TO PLACE NO. 1, PLACE NO. 2, PLACE NO. 3 AND PLACE NO. 4; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF SAID ORDINANCE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The City of Mesquite is hereby divided for the purpose of electing Councilmen for Place No. 1, Place No. 2, Place No. 3 and Place No. 4 into four (4) districts which shall be known as District No. 1, District No. 2, District No. 3 and District No. 4.

District No. 1 shall be comprised of all that portion of the City located North of U. S. Highway 67 as indicated on the Map of the City attached hereto and made a part hereof.


District No. 2 shall be comprised of all that portion of the City located South of U. S. Highway 67 and North of the Texas & Pacific Railroad Company right-of-way, as indicated on the Map of the City attached hereto and made a part hereof.

District No. 3 shall be comprised of all that portion of the City located West of South Mesquite Creek and South of the Texas & Pacific Railroad right-of-way, as indicated on the Map of the City attached hereto and made a part hereof.

District No. 4 shall be comprised of all that portion of the City located East of South Mesquite Creek and South of the Texas & Pacific Railroad right-of-way, as indicated on the Map of the City attached hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. Any territory hereafter annexed to the City shall upon annexation become a part of that District described above in which it is situated.

SECTION 3. WHEREAS, at a Special election to be held on the 3rd day of December, 1960, an amendment to the Home Rule Charter of the City will be submitted to a vote of the people which, if adopted, will provide for the division of the City into four (4) districts for election purposes, and the necessity of informing the voters prior to said election as to the manner in which the City will be divided creates an urgency and an energency for the immediate preservation of the public business and in the public health, safety and general welfare of the City so that this

ordinance can be considered at a called meeting of the City Council as provided for under Article IV, Section 18, of the Charter and further that this ordinance shall become effective immediately apon the adoption of proposed Amendment No. 1 of the Home Rule Charter at said special election.
