ORDINANCE NO. 411

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, DESIGNATING HOLLEY STREET A ONE-WAY STREET BETWEEN CARVER STREET AND BRYAN STREET; MAKING IT AN OFFENSE FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE OR OTHER VEHICLE FROM WEST TO EAST ON SAID STREET WHEN APPROPRIATE SIGNS HAVE BEEN ERECTED GIVING NOTICE THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$200.00; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Holley Street between Carver Street and Bryan Street is hereby designated a one-way street.

Section 2. All vehicular traffic must travel in a westerly direction, and it shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to operate a motor vehicle or other vehicle upon said street from west to east after appropriate signs giving notice thereof have been erected by the City Manager and the Chief of Police under the provisions of Chapter 10, Section 10-39 of the Mesquite City Code of 1960.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction in Corporation Court shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$200.00 for each offense.

Section 4. The fact that present traffic regulations are inadequate on the portion of the street described herein creates an urgency and an emergency, and in the preservation of the public business, property, health and safety requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law and charter in such cases provide.
