

ORDINANCE NO. 412

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE ADOPTING THE NOVEMBER, 1961 AMENDMENTS AND CORRECTIONS TO THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE, 1960 EDITION, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE NATIONAL BOARD OF FIRE UNDERWRITERS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the Fire Prevention Code, 1960 Edition, as recommended by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, is hereby amended by adopting the November, 1961 Amendments and Corrections thereto as follows, to wit:

Section 8.8 Anhydrous Ammonia.

Anhydrous ammonia shall be stored and handled in accordance with nationally recognized good practice.

Section 16.22g.(6) is hereby amended and corrected so as to change the third word in the third line to read "consideration" and the third word in the fifth line to read "on".

Section 16.64a. is hereby amended and corrected so as to change the word "automatic" in the first line to read "automotive".

Section 16.64d., is hereby amended and corrected to read as follows:

d. Automatic Dispensing Units. The installation and use of unattended coin operated dispensing devices for Class I flammable liquid is prohibited.

Section 16.64e.(1) is hereby amended and corrected to read as follows:

(1) Manual Nozzle. The dispensing of Class I flammable liquid into a fuel tank or into a container shall be under the control of a competent attendant at all times.

Section 30.1 is hereby amended and corrected to read as follows:

Section 30.1 Scope


Welding or cutting shall include gas, gaseous fuels generated from flammable liquids under pressure, or electric-arc welding or cutting or any combination thereof.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or the Fire Prevention Code as heretofore adopted shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction in the Corporation Court, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense, and each and every day such violation shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.


Section 3. All former ordinances or parts thereof which may conflict or are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance or of the Fire Prevention Code are hereby repealed.

Section 4. The fact that the November 1961 Amendments and Corrections of the Fire Prevention Code of 1960 have not been adopted by the City of Mesquite creates an urgency and an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public business, property, health and safety, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption of said ordinance as the law in such cases provides.
