ORDINANCE NO. 496

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 10, AETICLE V, SECTION 10-47 OF THE MESQUITE CITY CODE OF 1960 SO AS TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES UPON THE STREETS AND ALLEYS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLAR. ING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE. TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 10, Article V, Section 10-47 of the Mesquite City Code of 1960 is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

Section 10-47. Speeds Other than Reasonable and Prudent Unlawful.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any street within the corporate limits of the City of Mesquite, Texas, at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing having regard to the actual and potential hazards when approaching and crossing an intersection or a railway grade crossing; when approaching and going around a curve; when approaching a hill crest; when travelling upon a narrow or winding roadway; or when special hazards exist with respect to pedestrians or other traffic or by reason of weather or street conditions; and in every event, speed shall be so controlled as may be necessary to avoid colliding with any person, vehicle or other conveyance on or entering the street in compliance with legal requirements and the duty of all persons to use due care.

Section 10-47.1. Speeds Greater Than 30 MPH Not Reasonable or Prudent.

When no special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with Section 10-47 of this article, no person shall operate or drive any motor or other vehicle on any street within the corporate limits of the City of Mesquite, Texas, in an urban district as herein defined, at a greater speed than thirty (30) miles per hour, unless otherwise provided by subsequent sections of this article, and any speed in excess of thirty (30) miles per hour, unless otherwise provided by subsequent sections

of this article, shall be prima facie evidence that the speed is not reasonable or prudent and is unlawful.

Section 10-47.2. Determination of Maximum Speed Limits.

- (a) The City Manager of the City of Mesquite shall determine on the basis of engineering and traffic surveys the reasonable and safe maximum speed limits for each street within the corporate limits of the City of Mesquite and submit recommendations based on his investigation to the City Council of the City of Mesquite.
- (b) On the basis of the recommendations of the City Manager, the City Council may alter the prima facie maximum speed limit established in Section 10-47.1 of this ordinance as the Council may deem necessary.

Section 10-47.3. Posting of Speed Limit Signs.

The City Manager shall post the maximum and minimum speeds set forth in this ordinance by appropriate signs in conspicuous places so that every motorist may be aware of the speed limits established by this ordinance, except no sign shall be required where the maximum speed limit is thirty (30) miles per hour and where there is no minimum speed limit on that particular street.

Section 10-47.4. Minimum Speed Regulations.

- (a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle at such a slow speed as to impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic, except when reduced speed is necessary for safe operation or in compliance with the law.
- (b) The City Manager of the City of Mesquite may determine on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that slow speeds on any part of a street, highway or alley consistently impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Mesquite and submit recommendations based upon his investigation to the City Council.
- (c) On the basis of the recommendations of the City Manager, the City Council may determine and declare a minimum speed limit thereat or thereon and when appropriate signs are erected giving notice of such minimum speed limit, no person shall drive a vehicle below that limit except when necessary for safe operation or in compliance with the law.

Section 10-47.5. School Zones.

No person shall operate a motor or any other vehicle in any school traffic zone at a greater speed than twenty (20) miles per hour and any speed in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour shall be prima facie evidence that the speed is not reasonable or prudent and it is unlawful. The City Manager shall designate school traffic zones with appropriate street markings and signs. The speed limit designated for school traffic zones shall be effective only at such times as appropriate signs advising motorists to this effect are placed in conspicuous places.

Section 10-47.6. Authorized Emergency Vehicles. - When Speed Restrictions Not Applicable.

The speed limitations set forth in this article shall not apply to an authorized emergency vehicle when responding to an emergency call, or when used in the pursuit of an actual or suspected violator of the law, or when responding to but not upon returning from a fire alarm, and the driver thereof sounds audible signal by bell, siren or exhaust whistle, and/or when such emergency vehicle is equipped with at least one lighted lamp exhibiting red light visible under normal atmospheric conditions from a distance of 500 feet to the front of such vehicle; except in no event shall an ambulance operating as an authorized emergency vehicle exceed a speed of 10 miles per hour greater than the authorized posted speed limits on the route of travel of such ambulance. This provision shall not relieve the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the street, nor shall it protect the driver of any such vehicle from the consequence of a reckless disregard of the safety of others.

Section 10-47.7. Railroad Trains.

No person shall operate or run or cause to be operated or run within the corporate limits of the City of Mesquite any railroad engine, car or train of cars at a greater rate of speed than is safe and prudent.

Section 10-47.8. Speed Restrictions.

No person shall operate or drive a motor or other vehicle on the following designated streets at a greater speed than the speed designated for that street or portion

of that street as set forth below in this section, and any speed in excess of the limit set forth in this section shall be prima facie evidence that such speed is neither reasonable nor prudent and is unlawful.

Section 10-47.9. Definition of Urban District.

An urban district as defined herein means the territory contiguous to and including any highway or street which is built up with structures devoted to business, industry or dwelling houses situated at intervals of less than one hundred feet for a distance of one-fourth (1/4) mile or more.

SECTION 2. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in corporation court shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.

SECTION 3. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate to regulate the speed of motor vehicles upon the streets and highways of the City creates an urgency and an emergency, and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption as the law and chapter in such cases provide.
