

ORDINANCE NO. 500

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, REPEALING AN ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE ON FEBRUARY 16, 1954, GRANTING THE TEXAS AND PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY THE RIGHT TO INSTALL RAILROAD SPUR TRACKS ACROSS KEARNEY STREET; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That an ordinance of the City of Mesquite, Texas, duly passed by the City Council on February 16, 1954, granting the Texas and Pacific Railway Company permission to locate, construct, install and maintain railroad spur tracks across, over and through Kearney Street be, and the same is hereby repealed and such permission granted in said ordinance is hereby revoked.

SECTION 2. The fact that there is no longer a necessity for the Texas and Pacific Railway Company to construct railroad spur tracks across Kearney Street creates an urgency and an emergency, and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.
