## ORDINANCE NO. 711

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, DECLARING RESULT OF ELECTION FOR LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX, ORDERING THAT SAID TAX BE IMPOSED, INSTRUCTING CITY SECRETARY TO FORWARD CERTIFIED COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE AND MAP TO COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS, AND SUSPENDING RULES REQUIRING ORDINANCE TO BE READ UPON THREE SEPARATE DAYS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

Section I. There came on to be considered the Returns of an election held on the 5th day of December, 1967, upon the question of the adoption of a local sales and use tax for the benefit of said City in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 207, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, 1967, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said Returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 1414 votes, of which number 744 votes were cast "FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city," and 628 votes were cast "AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city," and said question or proposition having been approved by 116 votes.

Section II. The majority of the qualified voters having voted for the adoption of said local sales and use tax, the said tax is hereby imposed in said City and shall become effective as provided in said House Bill 207, and the City Secretary is hereby instructed to forward to the Comptroller of Public Accounts, State Capitol, Austin, Texas, by registered or certified mail a certified copy of this ordinance and a map of the City clearly showing the boundaries thereof.

Section III. The rule requiring that an ordinance shall be read on three separate days is hereby suspended and this ordinance shall become effective as provided by charter of this City and the laws of the State of Texas.
