

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR ONE-WAY STREETS AT THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS; TO WIT: MILITARY PARKWAY, EAST BOUND, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH SCYENE ROAD TO CARMACK STREET; DAVIS STREET, EAST BOUND, FROM CARMACK STREET TO PHILLIP; SCYENE ROAD, WESTBOUND, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH CARMACK STREET TO MILITARY PARKWAY; MAIN STREET, WEST BOUND, FROM PHILLIP STREET TO CARMACK STREET; BY PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION OF APPROPRIATE SIGNS; BY PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE ERECTION OF SUCH SIGNS; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, BY PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the following streets shall be, and the same are hereby, made one-way from the locations and in the directions below indicated; to wit:

- A. Military Parkway, eastbound from its intersection with Scyene Road to Carmack Street.
- B. Davis Street, eastbound from Carmack Street to Phillip Street.
- C. Scyene Road, westbound from its intersection with Carmack Street to Military Parkway.
- D. Main Street, westbound from Phillip Street to Carmack Street.

SECTION 2. That the City Manager is hereby directed to cause to be erected adequate signs to appraise the motoring public that those streets, as set forth in Section 1 above, have been designated one-way streets.


SECTION 3. That such signs, as set forth in Section 2 above, shall be erected and in place no later than the 28th day of August A. D. 1969.

SECTION 4. That it is the intent of the Mesquite City Council that the provisions of this ordinance be deemed severable and in the event any such provisions be declared invalid or unconstitutional for any reason such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not effect those provisions hereof left standing nor the provisions of any other ordinance of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 5. That any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefore shall be fined in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).



That the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are not adequate to properly regulate traffic on those streets designated in Section 1 above, constitutes an urgency and emergency in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare and necessitates that this ordinance become effective immediately from and after its date of passage and the publication of its caption as the law in such cases permits.


