

ORDINANCE NO. 958

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 10.61.2 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, BY PROVIDING THAT WHEN SIGNS ARE ERECTED, PARKING OR STANDING OF VEHICLES ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF HILLCREST STREET AS DESCRIBED HEREIN IS PROHIBITED; BY PROVIDING THAT PARKING OR STANDING OF VEHICLES ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF EMERALD DRIVE AS DESCRIBED HEREIN IS PROHIBITED; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10.61.2 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, is hereby amended as follows; in all other respects said Section and Code to remain in full force and effect:

The provision prohibiting parking or standing of vehicles on the South side of Hillcrest Street is deleted and there is substituted the following:

"When signs are erected to such effect no person shall park or leave standing a vehicle at any time upon the portions of the street described below:

"The South side of Hillcrest Street from a point even with the East curblin of Hillcrest Community Center parking lot to the West curblin of the Easterly-Most drive of the Hillcrest Swimming Pool parking lot.

"The South side of Emerald Drive from a point even with the East curblin of the West parking lot to a point even with the West curb of the East parking lot of Range baseball field."

SECTION 2. Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.


