

## ORDINANCE NO. 1065

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF REVISED SALARY PLANS, AS ATTACHED HERETO EXHIBIT "A" AND EXHIBIT "B", TO BECOME A PART OF THE BUDGET FOR THE 1972-73 FISCAL YEAR; BY PROVIDING THAT EXHIBIT "A" REVISED SALARY PLAN, ALONG WITH THE ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS AS SHOWN BY SCHEDULE I AND ATTACHED THERETO, SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 1972, AND EXHIBIT "B" REVISED SALARY PLAN SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1973; BY APPROPRIATING AND SETTING ASIDE OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND AND OTHER REVENUES OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, ADEQUATE MONIES FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE REVISED SALARY PLAN; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That there is hereto adopted for the City of Mesquite, Revised Salary Plans, as attached hereto, Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B", to become a part of the Budget for the 1972-73 Fiscal year; by providing that Exhibit "A" Revised Salary Plan shall become effective October 1, 1972, with the additions and deletions as shown by Schedule I attached to Exhibit "A", and Exhibit "B" Revised Salary Plan shall become effective January 1, 1973. That such Revised Salary Plans shall apply to the job classifications and monthly rates of salary as set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B", attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance for all intents and purposes.

SECTION 2. That such Revised Salary Plans as hereinabove adopted shall become effective on the 1st days of October, 1972, and January, 1973, respectively.

SECTION 3. That adequate monies shall be appropriated from the General Fund and other revenues of the City of Mesquite to provide for the operation and maintenance of the Revised Salary Plans herein adopted; and the City Manager is hereby directed to make appropriate allocations for this purpose.

SECTION 4. That the present Salary Plan of the City of Mesquite is inadequate to provide stability and continuity of employment among City employees performing essential city services constitutes an urgency and an emergency in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare and makes necessary that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from its date of passage and publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.
