

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, BY PROVIDING THAT WHEN NOTICE IS GIVEN BY THE POSTING OF SIGNS OR MARKING OF CURBS, PARKING OR STANDING SHALL BE PROHIBITED ON DALWORTH STREET BETWEEN CARMACK STREET AND GROSS ROAD - NORTH SIDE; ANY BY PROVIDING A TWO (2) HOUR LIMITATION ON PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF DALWORTH STREET BETWEEN GROSS ROAD AND CARMACK STREET, BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10-61.2 is hereby amended by adding the following, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

"When signs are erected or curbs marked giving notice thereof, no person shall park or stand a vehicle at any time upon said street; or portions, thereof, described as follows:

"Dalworth Street between Carmack Street and Gross Road - North Side."

SECTION 2. That Chapter 10 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, Texas, is amended by adding Section 10-61.6, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect, to wit:

Two hour parking limitation. When signs are erected or curbs marked giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for more than a two (2) hour period upon said street or portions thereof, described as follows:

"Dalworth Street between Carmack Street and Gross Road - South Side."

SECTION 3. Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.


