

ORDINANCE NO. 1241

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 10-61.2 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, BY PROVIDING THAT WHEN NOTICE IS GIVEN BY THE POSTING OF SIGNS OR MARKING OF CURBS, PARKING SHALL BE PRO-HIBITED ON THE EAST SIDE OF EBRITE STREET BETWEEN HIGHLAND VILLAGE DRIVE AND ROSABELLE DRIVE; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT EMERGENCY PARKING SHALL BE ALLOWED FOR DELIVERY AND PICKUP OF PATIENTS AT MESQUITE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL BETWEEN TWO POINTS, TWENTY-FIVE FEET EITHER SIDE OF THE CENTERLINE OF THE MAIN ENTRANCE WALKWAY OF SAID HOSPITAL; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVID-ING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10-61.2 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, is hereby amended by adding the following; in all other respects said Section and Code to remain in full force and effect:

"When signs are erected to such effect no person shall park or leave standing a vehicle at any time upon the portions of the street described below:

The East side of Ebrite Street between Highland Village Drive and Rosabelle Drive.

Provided, however, that emergency parking shall be allowed for delivery and pickup of patients at Mesquite Memorial Hospital between two points, twenty-five feet either side of the centerline of the main entrance walkway of said hospital."



SECTION 2. Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.

SECTION 4. The fact that the Code of the City of Mesquite, Texas, is inadequate for the necessary protection of the public comfort and general welfare, creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from its passage and publication as the law in such cases provides.
