ORDINANCE NO. 1258

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 10-61.1 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, BY PROHIBITING PARKING ON INTERSTATE 30 SOUTH SERVICE ROAD BOTH SIDES FROM A POINT 275 FEET EAST OF EDGEBROOK TO THE WEST CURB LINE OF THE SERVICE RAMP OF GUS THOMASSON ROAD; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10-61.1 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

When signs are erected or curbs marked giving notice to such effect, no person shall park or leave standing a vehicle at any time upon the portions of the streets described herein:

In addition to those listed in said Section,

<u>Street</u>	<u>Location</u>
Interstate Highway 30 South Service Road	Both sides from a point 275 feet east of Edgebrook to the west curb line of the ser- vice ramp of Gus Thomasson Road.

SECTION 2. That all ordinances of the City of Mesquite in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are, hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and all ordinances not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That should any paragraph, sentence, sub-division, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Section 10.61-1 or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 4. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.

SECTION 5. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate to protect the safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Mesquite, creates an urgency and an emergency and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law and charter in such cases provide.
