

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER X, SECTION 47.5, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY ESTABLISHING CERTAIN SCHOOL ZONES; BY PROVIDING THE LOCATION AND TIME OF SAID SCHOOL ZONES AND ESTABLISHING THE MAXIMUM PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMIT DURING SUCH PERIOD TO BE TWENTY (20) MILES PER HOUR, BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter X, Section 47.5, of the Code of the City of Mesquite is amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following streets and portions thereof are hereby designated as school zones for the schools indicated from 7:30 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., and said streets and portions thereof are hereby zoned for a maximum speed of twenty (20) miles per hour during such times. Any speed in excess of said maximum shall be prima facie unreasonable and imprudent.

1. To the list of designated streets in Section 10-47.5 the following is added:

McKenzie	Emerald from Kensington Drive to 250' south of Stephens Green Drive

	Concord Drive from Stephens Green Drive to Kensington Drive
North Mesquite High School	Town East Boulevard from a point 340' west of the west curbline of IH 635 Service Road westerly to a point 750' west of the west curbline of IH 635 Service Road.

Bryan-Belt Line Road from a point 50 feet north of the north curb-line of Newsom northerly to the south curblines of Davis Street.

Gleneagle Drive from Oates Drive to Whitson Way

Whitson Way from Ashwood Drive to Gleneagle Drive.


SECTION 2. That all ordinances, or portions thereof, of the City of Mesquite in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Section 47.5 or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.


SECTION 4. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.

SECTION 5. That the ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate to control the rate of speed of vehicles around certain public schools creates an urgency and an emergency and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall become effective immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law and charter in such cases provides.
