

ORDINANCE NO. 2071

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER X, SECTION 47.5, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY DELETING A CERTAIN SCHOOL ZONE FOR VANSTON MIDDLE SCHOOL; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter X, Section 47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following streets and portions thereof are hereby designated as school zones for the schools indicated from 7:30 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., and said streets and portions thereof are hereby zoned for a maximum speed of twenty (20) miles per hour during such times. Any speed in excess of said maximum shall be prima facie unreasonable and imprudent.

1. To the list of designated streets in Section 10-47.5, the following are deleted:

<u>SCHOOL</u>	<u>LOCATION OF SCHOOL ZONE</u>
Vanston Middle School	Oates Drive from 200 feet west of west curb line of Forrest Drive to west curb line to Live Oak

SECTION 2. That all ordinances, or portions thereof, of the City of Mesquite in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Section 47.5 or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 4. That the ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately regulate the rate of speed of vehicles around Vanston Middle School creates an urgency and an emergency and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires

that this ordinance shall become effective immediately from and after its passage and the publication of caption, as the law and charter in such cases provides.
