ORDINANCE NO. 2107

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY PROVIDING FOR THE DELETION OF SUB-PARAGRAPHS (d) AND (e) AND THE GRANTING OF TEMPORARY PERMITS BY THE CITY MANAGER FOR OUTDOOR SALES ACTIVITY CONDUCTED FOR EITHER PROFIT OR NON-PROFIT MOTIVATED OWNERS AND ORGANIZATIONS FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY (30) DAYS; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 14, Section 14-13 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

Section 14-13, sub-paragraphs (d) and (e) are hereby deleted and a new sub-paragraph (d) is adopted as follows:

- (d) The City Manager may, when he determines, in his discretion, that such will further the interests of the City and the inhabitants thereof, grant temporary permits for outdoor sales activities for not more than thirty (30) days conducted by either profit or non-profit motivated owners or organizations.
- SECTION 2. That all ordinances, or portions thereof, of the City of Mesquite in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.
- SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of 1973, of the City of Mesquite, and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.
- SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate to protect the health and welfare the

inhabitants of the City of Mesquite creates an urgency and an emergency and necessitates that this ordinance become effective immediately from and after its date of passage and the publication of its caption as the law in such cases provides.
