

## ORDINANCE NO. 2248

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 10-47.5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY ESTABLISHING A NEW SCHOOL ZONE; BY PROVIDING THE LOCATION AND TIME OF SAID SCHOOL ZONE AND ESTABLISHING THE MAXIMUM PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMIT DURING SUCH PERIOD TO BE TWENTY (20) MILES PER HOUR; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 10-33.12 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY ADDING CERTAIN NEW LANGUAGE, THEREBY ESTABLISHING A NO U-TURN LOCATION NORTH BOUND ON MOTLEY DRIVE AT HILTON; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 10, Section 10-47.8 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following language shall be added to Chapter 10, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

SCHOOLLOCATION OF SCHOOL ZONE

Tosch

Baker Drive from Greenhill Drive  
to Northview Drive

SECTION 2. Chapter 10, Section 10-33.12 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect.

The following language shall be added to Chapter 10, Section 10-33.12 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

- (2) No U-Turn sign:  
Northbound Motley Drive at Hilton Drive

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of

the public health, safety, and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
