A STATE OF THE PARTY OF THE PAR

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING SECTION 11-8 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY PROVIDING FOR THE HOURS OF WORK FOR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY OUTSIDE AN ENCLOSED STRUCTURE; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CIT MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 11-8 of the Code of the City of Mesquis hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in force and effect:

The following language is hereby added to Section 11-8 of the of the City of Mesquite:

Construction noise. Construction work which is loud and perfoutside an enclosed structure between 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. shibe prima facie evidence that such noise is unreasonable but shall rebuttable as in other cases.

Provided, however, that it is an affirmative defense that such work was of an emergency nature to the extent that foregoing such to other times of the day would create a serious hardship or enta substantial risk to the worker or others of loss of life, impairment of health or property loss.

SECTION 2. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitution the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full found effect.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating at the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be goof a Class C Misdemeanor, and upon conviction in the Municipal Conshall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City Mesquite are inadequate to protect the public interest, comfort, general welfare of the City of Mesquite, creates an urgency and a emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immedifrom and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as law in such cases provides.
