

ORDINANCE NO. 2390

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER X OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS BY ADDING CERTAIN LANGUAGE TO SECTION 10-33.12(2) THEREBY PROHIBITING U-TURNS ON SOUTHBOUND BIG TOWN BOULEVARD SOUTH OF PACES COURT AND ON GUS THOMASSON AT MOON DRIVE AND WHITSON WAY; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter X, Section 10-33.12(2) of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following language shall be added to the Section 10-33.12(2) of the Code of the City of Mesquite, which prohibits U-Turns:

Big Town Boulevard, southbound, 500 feet south of Paces Court Drive

Gus Thomasson at Moon Drive and Whitson Way

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Article 10-47.8, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of 1973, of the City of Mesquite, and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.



The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance as the law in such cases provides.
