ORDINANCE NO. 2406

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER X, SECTION 10-47.8 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY DELETING CERTAIN PRESENT LANGUAGE AND ADDING CERTAIN LANGUAGE THEREBY CHANGING CERTAIN SPEED ZONE LOCATIONS ON NORTH GALLOWAY AVENUE; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter X, Section 10-47.8 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following language shall be deleted from Chapter X, Section 10-47.8 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

STREET	EXTENT	SPEED (MPH)
North Galloway Ave.	From Town East Blvd. north to I.H. 635	40
North Galloway Ave.	From I.H. 635 to LaPrada Drive	35

The following language shall be added to Chapter X, Section 10-47.8 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

STREET	EXTENT	SPEED (MPH)
North Galloway Ave.	From Town East Blvd. to 1.30	40
North Galloway Ave.	From 1.H.30 to LaPrada Drive	35

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Article 10-47.8, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.
