ORDINANCE NO. 2408

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 10-68 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE THEREBY DESIGNATING PORTIONS OF GUS THOMASSON ROAD, PEACHTREE ROAD AND FORNEY ROAD AS TRUCK ROUTES AND ELIMINATING A PORTION OF TOWN EAST BOULEVARD AS A DESIGNATED TRUCK ROUTE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 10-68 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects said section and code to remain in full force and effect:

1. To the list of streets designated "truck routes" the following is deleted:

Name of Street

Limits

Town East Boulevard

Between U.S. Highway 80 and a point 2400 feet east of Interstate Highway 635

2. To the list of streets designated "truck routes" the following is added:

Name of Street

Limits

Gus Thomasson Road

Between Town East Boulevard and U.S. Highway 80

Peachtree Road

Between Skyline Drive and Scyene Road (Highway 352)

Forney Road

Between Town East Boulevard and the west city limits

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconsitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Article 10-47.8, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any

of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. Whereas, the fact that the ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately regulate truck routes within the city creates an urgency and emergency and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from its passage and publication as the law in such cases provides.


