

ORDINANCE NO. 2417

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 10-61.6 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, BY DELETING CERTAIN PRESENT LANGUAGE AND ADDING CERTAIN LANGUAGE, THEREBY PROVIDING THAT WHEN NOTICE IS GIVEN BY THE POSTING OF SIGNS OR MARKING OF CURBS, PARKING AND STANDING OF VEHICLES SHALL BE LIMITED TO TWO HOURS ON CERTAIN STREETS; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That 10-61.6 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows; in all other respects said section and code to remain in full force and effect:

When notice is given by the erection of signs or the marking of curbs to such effect, it shall be unlawful to park or stand a vehicle for a period of more than two (2) hours on the following street:

1. To the list of designated streets in Section 10-61.6 the following is added:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Extent</u>	<u>Time</u>
Broad	West side (far west parking lane on Heritiage Square) from Main Street to Davis Street	7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday

2. To the list of designated streets in Section 10-61.6 the following is deleted:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Extent</u>	<u>Time</u>
Broad	The 100 block of Broad Street (Town Square) on the extreme east and west sides	7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday

SECTION 2. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor, and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two

Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 3. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
