

ORDINANCE 2459

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER X, SECTION 10-47.5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY DELETING CERTAIN PRESENT LANGUAGE THEREBY DELETING AN EXISTING SCHOOL ZONE LOCATION ON NORTH GALLOWAY BETWEEN BELMONT AND LONGVIEW; BY PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; BY PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter X, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following language shall be deleted from Chapter X, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

SCHOOL

Tisinger

LOCATION OF SCHOOL ZONE

North Galloway 50 feet north of Longview Street to 100 feet south of the south curb line of Highland Street

North Galloway southbound from 144 feet south of south curb of Belmont to 5 feet south of south curb of Hillcrest

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Article 10-47.5, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and emergency and in

the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall become effective immediately from and after its passage and the publication of caption, as the law in such cases provides.
