

ORDINANCE NO. 2468

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS,
ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF CHARGES FOR
COPYING OF PUBLIC RECORDS; BY PROVIDING FOR A
SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 1507 is hereby amended to
read as follows:

Two sided pages shall be considered two (2) pages if a copy of both sides are furnished.


The foregoing schedule, except where specified, does not include certification. The charge for certification, where not otherwise provided by law, shall be \$1.00 per instrument.

SECTION 2. Any copies of public records not covered by this schedule of charges shall be the same as the maximum recommended charge promulgated by the State Board of Control, or if no charge has been promulgated, then the actual cost computed on the basis of actual time expended and actual cost of copying.

SECTION 3. Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 4. The fact that the City of Mesquite has no adequate ordinance regulating charges for the reproduction or copying of public records creates an urgency and an emergency and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as the law in such cases provides.


