ORDINANCE NO. 2504

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE BY INCORPORATING CERTAIN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE THEREIN RELATING TO THE PROVISION OF EQUIPMENT FOR LOCAL PROGRAMMING AND/OR LOCAL ACCESS BROADCASTING, AND THE MAINTENANCE AND REPLACEMENT OF SAID EQUIPMENT; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE.

WHEREAS, Heritage Communications, Inc. (hereinaster reserved to as Heritage Cable) and the City of Mesquite (City) have heretosore entered into a nonexclusive cable television franchise; and

WHEREAS, a question has arisen under the Cable Television Franchise ordinance as to the respective responsibilities of Heritage Cable, the City, and certain third parties to provide equipment, personnel, and maintenance service for local programming and local access broad-casting under the City of Mesquite's cable franchise agreement; and

WHEREAS, both the City and Heritage Cable, in consideration of the mutual covenants and restrictions contained in the cable franchise agreement, wish to clarify the responsibilities and obligations of each of the parties to provide equipment, personnel, and maintenance service for local access broadcasting;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the following provisions are incorporated into the Cable Television Franchise ordinance for the City of Mesquite, Texas with all attachments thereto, as originally granted by the City to Warner Amex in City Ordinance No. 1636, dated October 6, 1980, and as later transferred to Heritage Communications, Inc., by Ordinance No. 2211, dated August 19, 1985. To the extent that the additional language contained herein conflicts with any other provision in the Cable Television Franchise ordinance as amended, the provisions of this ordinance shall control, in all other respects the Cable Television Franchise and amendments thereto to remain in full effect.

A. Ownership of Equipment Used for Local Programming/Local Access Broadcasting

A complete list of all the equipment which will be updated annually and is currently found in Eastfield College's broadcasting studio is attached to this ordinance as Exhibit "A", and included herein for all purposes. The ownership of the equipment found in the studio is of three types:

equipment originally furnished by Heritage Cable (or its predecessor Warner Amex) and equipment purchased out of the Community Access Fund generated from the dedication by Heritage Cable of one percent (1%) of its gross operating revenues. All equipment in this group is the property of Heritage Cable under the operational direction of Mesquite Cable Television Advisory Board. This equipment shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of or relocated to another studio by Heritage Cable, or its successors or assigns, without the prior approval of the Mesquite Cable Television Advisory Board.

- (2) Equipment purchased and owned by Eastfield College, but which is made available to users of local programming or local access programs. All property in this category remains the property of Eastfield College.
- (3) Equipment purchased and owned by Eastfield College, and which is exclusively made available to and used by Eastfield College students as part of the educational programs offered by Eastfield College. All property in this category is the property of Eastfield College.

B. Maintenance of Equipment Used for Local Access Broadcasting

Heritage Cable shall provide, at its sole expense, trained personnel, equipment, and replacement parts to maintain the equipment found at the Eastfield College studio used for local programming and local access, provided that Heritage Cable shall be required only to maintain the equipment described above in Sections 1.A(1) and 1.A(2) and more fully described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto.

C. Replacement of Equipment Used for Local Access Broadcasting

The replacement of equipment described in Section 1.A(1) used for local programming and local access shall be funded solely by the Community Access Fund generated by the one percent (1%) of gross operating revenue provided to City by Heritage Cable.

D. Compensation of Eastfield College for Operation of Local Access Studio

It is the intention of the City that this ordinance, as well as the Cable Television Franchise ordinance, not address the compensation, if any, to be paid Eastfield College by Heritage Cable in return for the provision of a studio at Eastfield College for local programming and/or local access broadcasting, or for the expenses of operating said studio. The City intends that Heritage Cable and Eastfield College negotiate between themselves on the question of whether Eastfield College should be compensated for any services in the area of local access or programming.

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part or provision so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.
