THE RESERVE AND ADDRESS OF THE PARTY OF THE

ORDINANCE NO. 2624

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2430 OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS BY ADDING CERTAIN NEW LANGUAGE, THEREBY AMENDING CERTAIN RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING ALL USERS OF THE PHIL L. HUDSON MUNICIPAL AIRPORT; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2430 of the City of Mesquite, Texas is hereby amended by renumbering the present Rules 37 and 38 to become Rules 38 and 39 and adding a new Rule 37 to read as follows:

Rule 37.

SKYDIVING/PARACHUTING. Due to safety considerations, parachuting/skydiving activities will not be allowed at the airport except during special events, such as airshows, open houses, etc. Approval will be by written permission of the City Manager through the Airport Manager. Proof of liability insurance will also be required prior to written approval.

SECTION 2. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars for each offense. This section is cumulative of all other penalties for violation of federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances.

SECTION 3. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present Rules and Regulations and Minimum Standards for the Phil L. Hudson Airport do not adequately protect the safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
