ORDINANCE NO. 2673

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER X, SECTION 10-47.5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY DELETING CERTAIN PRESENT LANGUAGE AND ADDING CERTAIN PRESENT LANGUAGE THEREBY EXTENDING A CERTAIN SCHOOL ZONE LOCATION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Chapter X, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

The following language shall be deleted in Chapter 10, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

SCHOOL

LOCATION OF SCHOOL ZONE

Cannaday

Franklin Drive, from 250 feet north to 250 feet south of Sabine Pass

The following language shall be added in Chapter 10, Section 10-47.5 of the Code of the City of Mesquite:

SCHOOL

Cannaday

LOCATION OF SCHOOL ZONE

Franklin Drive from a point 200 feet north of Americana Lane to 250 feet south of Sabine Pass

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hercof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Article 10-47.5, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City creates an urgency and emergency and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall become effective immediately from and after its passage and the publication of caption, as the law in such cases provides.
