

ORDINANCE NO. 2874

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 9 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY ADOPTING A NEW SECTION 9-207; THEREBY ESTABLISHING PARKING LIMITED TO LESS THAN TWO HOURS ON CERTAIN STREETS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 9 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended by adopting a new Section 9-207 as follows, in all other respects said Code and Chapter to remain in full force and effect:

Sec. 9-207. Parking limited to less than two hours on certain streets.

When notice is given by the erection of signs or the marking of curbs to such effect, it shall be unlawful to park or stand a vehicle on the following streets or portions thereof as designated:

<i>Street</i>	<i>Extent</i>	<i>Time</i>
Highland Village Drive	North side of Highland Village Drive from Ebrite Street to a point 235 feet west of that intersection	Ten (10) minutes between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, section or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of Section 9-207, or any other provision of the Code of the City of Mesquite.


SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. The fact that the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite do not adequately protect the safety of the inhabitants of the City, creates an urgency and emergency and in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall become effective immediately from and after its passage and the publication of caption, as the law in such cases provides.


