## ORDINANCE NO. \_ 3023

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS BY ADOPTING THE UNIFORM MECHANICAL CODE, 1994 EDITION, WITH CERTAIN AMENDMENTS AND DELETIONS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That Chapter 5, Article VII of the Code of the City of Mesquite, Texas is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects said Code and Chapter to remain in full force and effect:

Sec. 5-316. Uniform Mechanical Code - Adopted is amended by changing the phrase:

The Uniform Mechanical Code, 1991 Edition

to:

The Uniform Mechanical Code, 1994 Edition

Sec. 5-317. Amendments and deletions is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) Deletions. The following provisions of the Uniform Mechanical Code, 1994 Edition, are deleted:

Section 115.3; 115.3.1; 115.3.2. Plan review fees.

Table 1A. Mechanical permit fees.

SECTION 2. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars for each offense.
