ORDINANCE NO. 3040 File No. ZO 95-2

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE MESQUITE ZONING ORDINANCE, ADOPTED ON SEPTEMBER 4,1973, AND RECODIFIED ON NOVEMBER 21, 1988, BY DELETING SECTION 2-302A.4a AND BY ADOPTING A NEW REVISED SECTION 2-302A.4a REGARDING MINIMUM UNIT SIZES REQUIRED IN THE RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, through administration and experience, the Planning and Zoning Commission has determined that it is necessary to revise certain regulations so that the intended purposes of the Zoning Ordinance are best served; and

WHEREAS, the City Council did give public notice and did hold public hearings regarding the proposed amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance, adopted on September 4, 1973, and recodified on November 21, 1988, be and the same is hereby amended as follows, said Ordinance in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

a. Delete the existing Section 2-302A.4a in its entirety and adopt a new revised Section 2-302A.4a to read as follows:

AG R-1 R-1A R-2 R-2A R-3

4. Minimum Living Area (Sq.Ft.)
a. Single Family Residence

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this ordinance be abjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part of provisions hereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and shall not affect the validity of the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance as a whole.

or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance as amended, of the City of Mesquite, and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. Whereas the need to regulate proper development of the City of Mesquite, and the need to protect the public interest, comfort, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Mesquite creates an urgency and emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
