ORDINANCE NO. 3141 File No. ZO 97-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, ZONING **ORDINANCE AMENDING** MESQUITE THE ADOPTED ON SEPTEMBER 4, 1973, AND RECODIFIED ON NOVEMBER 21, 1988, BY DELETING SECTION 2-303 AND BY ADOPTING A NEW REVISED SECTION 2-303 EXTERIOR CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS; RESISTANT REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING PROVISIONS OF SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, through administration and experience, the Planning and Zoning Commissio has determined that it is necessary to revise certain regulations so that the intended purposes of th Zoning Ordinance are best served; and

WHEREAS, the City Council did give public notice and did hold public hearings regardin the proposed amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance, adopted on September 2 1973, and recodified on November 21, 1988, be and the same is hereby amended as follows, sai Ordinance in all other respects to remain in full force and effect:

Delete the existing Section 2-303 in its entirety and adopt a new revised Section 2 303 to read as follows:

All main buildings in the AG, R, and D districts shall be of fire resistant construction having at least 75% of the total exterior walls, excluding doors and windows, constructe of brick, stone, concrete block, stucco, or other masonry, or materials of equipment characteristics.

SECTION 2. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase, c section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the sam shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part of provisions hereof other tha

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the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional and shall not affect the validity of the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance as a whole.

SECTION 3. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance, as amended, and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for each offense.

Mesquite, and the need to protect the public interest, comfort, and general welfare of the City of Mesquite creates an urgency and emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
