ORDINANCE NO. 3516

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY DELETING SECTION 3-28(d) IN ITS ENTIREY AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 3-28(d) THEREBY REVISING THE MINIMUM INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR COMMERCIAL OPERATORS PROVIDING AIRCRAFT RENTAL AND FLIGHT TRAINING AT THE MESQUITE METRO AIRPORT; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas, has determined that it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens to revise the minimum insurance requirements for commercial operators providing aircraft rental and flight training at the Mesquite Metro Airport.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That Chapter 3 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended by deleting Section 3-28(d) in its entirety and adding a new Section 3-28(d) to read as follows, in all other respects said Code and Chapter to remain in full force and effect:

CHAPTER 3

AIRPORTS AND AIRCRAFTS

ARTICLE II. FIXED BASE OPERATORS; AIRPORT TENANTS

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That all ordinances or portions thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinances, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof are not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> That the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate to regulate certain commercial operators at the Mesquite Metro Airport creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
