ORDINANCE NO. <u>3582</u> File No. 1353-33

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE MESOUITE ZONING ORDINANCE ADOPTED ON SEPTEMBER 4, 1973, AND RECODIFIED ON TO NOVEMBER 21. 1988, SO AS APPROVE AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 3484 TO PROPERTY ZONED PLANNED DEVELOPMENT - GENERAL RETAIL TO ALLOW BOAT, TRAILER AND RECREATIONAL VEHICLE STORAGE SUBJECT CERTAIN STIPULATIONS: TO REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Mesquite and the governing body of the City of Mesquite, in compliance with the Charter of the City of Mesquite and State laws with reference to granting of zoning changes under the Zoning Ordinance Regulations and Zoning Map, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and after holding due hearings and affording a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to the persons interested and situated in the area, the City of Mesquite is of the opinion that the change of zoning may be granted herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance adopted on September 4, 1973, and recodified on November 21, 1988, be and the same is hereby amended by amending the Zoning Map of the City of Mesquite so as to approve an amendment to Ordinance No. 3484 on property zoned Planned Development - General Retail to allow boat, trailer and recreational vehicle storage subject to the following stipulations:

- A. Parking of boats, trailers and recreational vehicles (RVs) must be limited to striped spaces reserved for such uses or combination of uses. Such spaces must be designated on a revised planned development site plan and must not be visible from the public right-of-way or adjacent property.
- B. No boats, trailers and RVs can be parked in a loading area or encroach into the fire lane.
- C. All other vehicles are prohibited from parking overnight in this facility. This includes, but is not limited to, heavy construction equipment, portable concrete mixers and commercial trucks with more than two axles.
- D. All RVs must be in working, driving condition. All boats must be properly stored and secured on trailers or other appropriate towable equipment.
- E. No repair or maintenance work on RVs, boats or other vehicles is permissible in this facility. This provision does not apply to preparation for storage or removal of such items from the site.

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F. Individuals may not occupy or reside in RVs or boats overnight.

G. Truck rental is not permitted.

That the subject property is a 6.32-acre tract platted as Assured Addition, Block 1, Lot 1.

SECTION 2. That all ordinances, or portions thereof, of the City of Mesquite in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof are not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> That the property described in Section 1 of this ordinance shall be used only in the manner and for the purposes provided for by the Mesquite Zoning Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> That the foregoing change shall be, and it is, granted subject to any development of the land herein being developed in conformity with the requirements of current and/or future drainage improvement ordinances of the City of Mesquite, including Ordinance No. 3042, codified in Chapter 11 of the Code of the City of Mesquite.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for each offense.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> That the property described in Section 1 of this ordinance requires that it be given the above classification in order to permit its proper development and in order to protect the public interest, comfort and general welfare of the City of Mesquite, creates an urgency and emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance as the law in such cases provides.
