

ORDINANCE NO. 3702

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 9 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE BY AMENDING SECTION 9-244(A) THEREBY ADDING ANOTHER STREET AS A DESIGNATED TRUCK ROUTE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 9 of the Code of the City of Mesquite is hereby amended by amending Section 9-244(a) by adding another street as a designated truck route to read as follows, in all other respects said Code, Chapter and Section to remain in full force and effect:

<i>Name of Street</i>	<i>Limits</i>
South Belt Line Road	Between Cartwright Road and the south city limits

SECTION 2. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or portions thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof are not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for each offense.


SECTION 5. That the present ordinances of the City of Mesquite are inadequate in providing for the proper regulation of commercial motor vehicles on City streets, creates an urgency and an emergency for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of said ordinance, as the law in such cases provides.
