

ORDINANCE NO. 4191

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 9, SECTION 9-150 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, BY REVISING THE EXTENT OF THE SPEED LIMIT ON U. S. HIGHWAY 80 FROM WEST CITY LIMITS TO EAST CITY LIMITS; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENSE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 9, Section 9-150 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, Texas, is hereby amended as follows, in all other respects said Code, Chapter and Section to remain in full force and effect.

Sec. 9-150. Same – Designated for certain streets.

A. Amend by deleting the following:

<i>Street</i>	<i>Extent</i>	<i>Speed (mph)</i>
U.S. Highway 80	From west city limits to Town East Boulevard	60
U.S. Highway 80	From Town East Boulevard to Gus Thomasson Road	50
U.S. Highway 80	From Gus Thomasson Road to east city limits	60

B. Amend by adding the following:


<i>Street</i>	<i>Extent</i>	<i>Speed (mph)</i>
U.S. Highway 80	From west city limits to east city limits	60

SECTION 2. That all ordinances or portions thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed. To the extent that such ordinances or portions thereof are not in conflict herewith, the same shall remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 3. That should any word, sentence, clause, paragraph or provision of this ordinance be held to be invalid or unconstitutional the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. That any person (as defined in Chapter 1, Section 1-2 of the Code of the City of Mesquite, Texas, as amended) violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C Misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense, provided, however, if the maximum penalty provided for by this ordinance for an offense is greater than the maximum penalty provided for the same offense under the laws of the State of Texas, the maximum penalty for violation of this ordinance for such offense shall be the maximum penalty provided by the laws of the State of Texas. Each day or portion of a day any violation of this ordinance continues shall constitute a separate offense.
