Any permanent facilities established along this route will support the future light rail line; and (3) Begin the alternatives analysis and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process by January 2010 to determine a light rail alignment through Mesquite to be funded by grant money if possible or 4B money if grant money is unavailable.

(7) It was Council consensus to authorize staff to proceed with carpet replacement and direct staff to place cost estimates and priorities on a future agenda.
