Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance for Application No. 1189-3-2009 to amend Planned Development Ordinance No. 3287 to clarify the limits of development authorized within the Airport Runway Protection Zone and to require either (a) the Traditional Neighborhood Development or Clustered Land Development standards of the K20 zoning district or (b) elimination of multi-family housing as a permitted use for Parcel 4 of the Falcon's Lair Planned Development District located generally southeast of Lawson Road from Clay-Mathis Road to the city limits of Mesquite. (Six letters in favor and five letters in opposition to the proposed amendment have been received. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends approval of the application.)
