RESOLUTION NO. 15-60

ACCEPTING BID FOR TWO GENERAL ACCOUNTING MACHINES FOR THE NEW CITY HALL AND PROVIDING FOR THE DELIVERY OF WARRANTS IN PAYMENT THEREFOR

WHEREAS, on September 4, 1959, the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas, passed an ordinance which, among other things, authorized the issuance of City of Mesquite City Hall and Jail Time Warrants, Series 1959, for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness due for the construction of a City Hall and to pay part or all of the Architect's fees and inspection and testing fees, and to pay the cost of furnishing and equipping the City Hall; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a notice issued by the City on June 2, 1960, the City received bids on June 20, 1960, for the sale to the City of two general accounting machines for the new City Hall, and the City Council has now thoroughly studied and analyzed said bids;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE:

- 1. The Burroughs Corporation is found, adjudged and declared to be the lowest responsible bidder for the sale of two general accounting machines to the City for the new City Hall in accordance with the notice of sale and specifications, such bid being in the amount of \$11,950.80. Reference is made to said bid for the description of equipment included therein. Said bid is hereby accepted.
- 2. When such bidder above named completes its contract for supplying equipment to the City, the City Secretary and the Mayor shall deliver to said bidder \$11,000.00 of the above described Warrants, being Nos. 90 to 100, both inclusive, and pay the remainder of the contract price in cash.
