

RESOLUTION NO. 46-62

WHEREAS, on November 6, 1962, there will be submitted to the voters of the State of Texas an amendment to the Texas Constitution known as the "Trial De Novo Amendment", and

WHEREAS, the adoption of such amendment will be detrimental to the welfare of all cities in the State of Texas, and will materially interfere with the ability of such cities to carry out their duties and responsibilities, and

WHEREAS, the adoption of such amendment will tend to destroy the system of checks and balances which is so basic to our form of government, and


WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Mesquite that the Trial De Novo Amendment to the Texas Constitution should not be adopted; Now, therefore,


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Mesquite does by this resolution go on record as being opposed to the adoption of the Trial De Novo Amendment to the Texas Constitution which is being submitted to the voters of the State of Texas on November 6, 1962.

Section 2. That the voters of the City of Mesquite are urged to vote against the adoption of the Trial De Novo Amendment in the general election being held on November 6, 1962.
