

RESOLUTION NO. 14-65  
 CANVASS OF THE RETURNS  
 AND DECLARATION OF THE  
 RESULTS OF AN ELECTION  
 HELD IN THE CITY OF  
 MESQUITE, TEXAS, ON  
 APRIL 6, 1965, FOR  
 THE ELECTION OF A  
 MAYOR AND COUNCILMEN  
 FOR PLACES 1, 2 AND 6

WHEREAS, a City Election was held on April 6, 1965, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and Councilmen for Places Nos. 1, 2 and 6 for a term of two years;

WHEREAS, immediately after said election the Presiding Judge and other officers holding said election made their returns of the results thereof to the City Council;

It appearing that Jim Thompson received a majority of votes cast for the office of Councilman, Place 1, he is hereby declared to be elected to said office to serve after qualifying, for a term of two (2) years, commencing April, 1965, and until his successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified.

It appearing that Frank Schulz, Jr. received a majority of votes for the office of Councilman, Place 2, he is hereby declared to be elected to said office to serve after qualifying, for a term of two (2) years, commencing April, 1965, and until his successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified.

It appearing that no candidate received a majority of the votes cast for the office of Councilman, Place 6, it is necessary to call a run-off election to be held April 20, 1965, for the purpose of deciding between Hugh R. Motley and B. J. Smith for the office of Councilman, Place 6.

THAT this Resolution declaring the results of the election held April 6, 1965, shall become effective immediately after its passage.
