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## RESOLUTION NO. 2-67

WHEREAS, according to the City Charter of the City of Mesquite, Texas, an election shall be held the first Saturday in April of each year for the purpose of electing City Councilmen or a Mayor and City Councilmen; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the City Council call an election to be held April 1, 1967 to comply with the City Charter:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That an election shall be held April 1, 1967, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and a Councilman from each of the following places: Nos. 1, 2 and 6. Candidates for Places Nos. 1 and 2 must have resided in Districts 1 and 2, respectively, as heretofore established by City Charter, for a period of 120 days next preceding the election date.

Section 2. Voting shall take place at Polling Place No. 1, being located at Fire Station No. 1, 320 South Galloway, and at Polling Place No. 2, being located at Fire Station No. 2, 4609 Sarazen Drive. The polls shall be open from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

All qualified voters residing in County Election Precincts Nos. 231, 245 and 254 shall vote at Polling Place No. 1. All qualified voters residing in County Election Precincts Nos. 211 and 252 shall vote at Polling Place No. 2.

None but legally qualified voters of the City of Mesquite shall be entitled to vote at said election. All persons who have resided in the City of Mesquite for six (6) months immediately preceding the election and who are otherwise legally qualified to vote under the laws of the State of Texas are authorized to vote at said election.

Section 3. Notice of such election shall be posted in three (3) public places within the limits of the City at least twenty (20) days before the election day. A certified copy of this resolution shall be attached to said notice and made a part thereof. A return of such posting shall be made by the affidavit of the City Secretary.

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Section 4. Said election shall be held in accordance with the Election Code of the State of Texas, the Statutes of the State of Texas, and the Charter and ordinances of the City of Mesquite, and shall be in conformity with the procedures set forth herein.

Section 5. Absentee voting shall be conducted in the office of the City Secretary, beginning at 8 A.M. on March 13, 1967, and on each day thereafter, except Saturdays and Sundays, through 5 P.M., March 28, 1967.

Section 6. The candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast for the office of Mayor shall be elected for that office. The candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast for Councilman for each Place shall be elected Councilman for that Place for which he is a candidate. In the event any candidate does not receive a majority of the votes cast for a particular office and a run-off election is necessary, said run-off election shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Mesquite.

Section 7. Leonard Burris is hereby appointed Presiding Judge and Jack Carr is hereby appointed as Alternate Presiding Judge of Polling Place No. 1: Herbert Goodenough is hereby appointed as Presiding Judge and Edwin Burton is hereby appointed as Alternate Presiding Judge of Polling Place No. 2, to conduct said election, and they shall appoint such clerks as may be necessary to assist them in the holding of said election, but the maximum number of clerks at Polling Place No. 1 shall not exceed six clerks, and the maximum number of clerks at Polling Place No. 2 shall not exceed five clerks. All judges and clerks shall be qualified voters in the City of Mesquite. The presiding judges and clerks shall be paid in the amount of \$1.00 per hour not to exceed fourteen hours.

Section 8. After the holding of said election, the election judges shall promptly make their returns to the City Secretary and the City Secretary shall thereafter present such returns to the City Council for the canvassing of said election.
