

WHEREAS, the main post office in the City of Mesquite, Texas, was constructed ten years ago when the population was 15,000; and

WHEREAS, it was anticipated that the facility would be able to provide adequate service for several years even if the population doubled; and

WHEREAS, the population of the City of Mesquite has swelled to 47,000 in ten short years; and

WHEREAS, the physical growth of the City has isolated the existing post office in an inaccessible location for a majority of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, overcrowded customer service areas create inconveniences for patrons; and

WHEREAS, these inadequacies will be compounded each year with the continued growth of the population;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas:

THAT the Mesquite City Council strongly encourages the construction of a new post office facility to provide adequate services now and in the future.
