

RESOLUTION NO. 3-70

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, TO PROVIDE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC REGULATORY HUMPS IN ALLEYS WHICH ABUT RESIDENTIAL LOTS.

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that a hazard to children and other pedestrians exists because of motor vehicle traffic in certain public alleys that abut residential lots in the City, and

WHEREAS, the City Council further finds the residents of such abutting lots desire, in certain instances, that traffic regulatory humps be installed in such alleys.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby declared to be the policy of the City of Mesquite that traffic regulatory humps shall be installed in public alleys which abut residential lots in the City of Mesquite, under the conditions set forth in Sections 2 and 3 below.

SECTION 2. That no such traffic regulatory humps shall be installed except by the signed petition of not less than three-fourths (3/4) of the owners of lots abutting such alley in its entire length between its intersection with one public street and its intersection with another public street or alley.

SECTION 3. That said signed petition be submitted to the City Council for approval.


SECTION 4. That such regulatory humps as are to be installed pursuant to Sections 2 and 3 above, shall be of a design approved by the Director of Public Works and installed by the City of Mesquite at intervals no less than three hundred feet.

SECTION 5. That this resolution shall become effective immediately from and after its date of passage.


