## RESOLUTION NO. 14-75

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, OPPOSING THE PROPOSED 170 MILLION DOLLAR COUNTY ROAD BOND PROGRAM IN ITS PRESENT STATE AND CALLING UPON THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT TO INCLUDE FULL FUNDING FOR PROJECTS 36 AND 37 AND INDICATING THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE PROGRAM WITH THESE CHANGES; AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the County of Dallas is being requested to submit to the voters a 170 million dollar bond issue for road construction and other public improvements; and

WHEREAS, the projects proposed in the City of Mesquite are, in the opinion of the City Council of the City of Mesquite, inadequate considering the population and the needs of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed County Road Bond Program would be inequitable to the citizens of Mesquite; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite has called upon the proponents of this program to make the City of Mesquite share of public improvements more equitable to no avail;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas, does hereby express its opposition to the proposed County Road Bond Program in its present state and request and calls upon the Dallas County Commissioners Court to oppose such Bond Program in its present state because of the inequality toward the citizens of the City of Mesquite.

SECTION 2. That the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas, does hereby call upon the County Commissioners Court to include full funding for Projects 36 and 37 to County six lane boulevard concrete standards in addition to Projects Numbers 40 and 90 as shown in the proposed program and hereby indicates the City Council's support for the Program with these changes.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such cases provides.
