SECTION 1. That Billy G. York, City Manager of the City of Mesquite, be and is hereby authorized to file the attached application for funds under Section 8 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 on behalf of the City of Mesquite, Texas; and to certify to all understandings and assurances required under said Act relating to the application, acceptance and use of Federal funds for this federally assisted program and such other assurances and understandings as may be required.

SECTION 2. That Billy G. York, City Manager, is hereby designated as the City's chief executive officer and authorized representative of the City of Mesquite, Texas, for the purpose of acting in connection with the application and to provide such additional information as may be required.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such cases provides.
