RESOLUTION NO. 24-76

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, DECLARING THE POLICY OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR PROPERTY OWNER INITIATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION TO REMOVE TRAFFIC REGULATORY HUMPS IN ALLBYS AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite has heretofore established a procedure for property owner initiation of consideration of installation of traffic control humps in alleys; and

WHEREAS, there exists no procedure for property owner initiation of proceedings to remove traffic control humps, once installed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Mesquite does hereby establish the following procedure for property owner initiation of proceedings to remove traffic control humps from alleys:

- A. Upon presentment to the City of Mesquite of a petition duly signed by ninety per cent (90%) of the property owners whose property abuts a section of alleyway lying between two streets requesting removal of traffic control humps in such alley or section thereof, the City Manager, after checking the number of tracts of land abutting said alley or section thereof and the number of signatures required to constitute ninety per cent (90%) thereof shall, upon favorable determination, place such item on the City Council Agenda for consideration.
- B. Upon consideration by the City Council, the Council shall take such action as they determine to be in the interest of the City, giving consideration however, to the desires of those making the request.
- C. Upon decision by the Council cause the removal of the traffic regulatory humps, the City Manager shall schedule such removal as in the case of other public work of the City.
- D. The City Manager, upon request, shall make available through the Department of Community Development, forms for petitions for action by the Council.

SECTION 2. Nothing in this resolution shall in any manner limit the powers of the City Council in their control over the public streets and alleys of the City provided by law without petition, but relates solely to instances wherein the petition process is employed.
