A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION IN THE AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$619,661 FOR FEDERAL FUNDS UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT AND DESIGNATING C.K. DUGGINS AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING REQUIRED ASSURANCES AND ACTING IN CONNECTION WITH SAID APPLICATION, AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite is entitled to certain funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of an amount not to exceed \$619,661 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for the 1984-85 program year; and

WHEREAS, the City has conducted public hearings; and

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WHEREAS, the Mesquite City Council has considered the suggestions and recommendations raised at the hearings; and

WHEREAS, it is the public interest of the citizens of the City of Mesquite that application be made for such funds:

HOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

That the 1984-85 Final Statement of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of CDBG FUNDS is hereby approved and adopted by the City of Mesquite as its official 1984-85 Community Development Block Grant Program.

Section 2. That C. K. Duggins, City Manager of the City of Mesquite, be and is hereby authorized to file an application for funds under the Housing and Community Development Act on behalf of the City of Mesquite, Texas, and to certify to all understandings and assurances required under said Act including, but not limited to, OME Circulars A-92 and A-102 and Federal Management Circular 74-4; National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 respectively, Executive Orders 11063 and 11246 and such other assurances and understandings as may be required. assurances and understandings as may be required.

FINAL STATEMENT of COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVES and PROJECTED USE OF FUNDS"

CITY OF MESQUITE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Community Development objective of the City of Mesquite is to assure decent, viable living areas through projects and activities which stabilize and improve low and moderate income neighborhoods by the elimination of blighting influences such as the improvement of housing conditions and the improvement/provision of adequate public facilities and services.

Certain activities such as street reconstruction, utility improvements, and drainage work will be undertaken through continued programs funded by the City. Activities which will aid toward accomplishing the Community Development objective to be undertaken with 1984-1985 Community Development Block Grant Funds (\$619,661) are as follows:

Street Improvementa

Reconstruct selected streets in the CDBG Target Areas with asphalt overlay

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Bruton Road (From LEF to 900 feet west)
 Replace broken and deteriorated water mains
 with new 12-inch line

 Pecan - Change service from sub-standard water main on the north side to the large main on the south -- kill sub-main.

New Market - (From LBJ west to Hickory Tree)- Build new concrete inlets and some ditch reconstruction

Housing Rehabilitation

Assist low income homeowners to rehabilitiate housing units. A maximum of a forgivable \$10,000 will be available to eligible homeowners to upgrade the unit to meet code standards:

Administration

Administer and monitor all aspects of the CDBG Program.

Contingency 20,000

The proposed amount of CDBG Funds which will benefit low and moderate income persons is \$559,661. This is 96% of the total grant for 1984-85. The completion of the above listed projects will not cause any displacement of persons from their homes.

Current Federal regulations require the description of the use of CDEG Entitlement Funds expended during fiscal years 1932 and 1983. The use of 1982 and 1983 funds is as follows:

The use of the CDBG Funds for these projects successfully completed the Community Development Objectives in 1982 and 1983 as the maximum feasible priority was $g' \cdot \cdots$ activities benefiting low and moderate income persons.
