## RESOLUTION NO. 3-89

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Dallas Central Appraisal District has adopted a policy on selection and appointment of members to the Appraisal Review Board (hereinafter "ARB") which provides that the maximum term of office a member of the ARB will be allowed to serve is three two-year terms for a total of six years; and

WHIREAS, although the Board of Directors was attempting to establish criteria so that the members of the ARB would "remain objective and unbiased in its responsibilities to the citizens of greater Dallas County", this Board is of the opinion and finds that knowledge and experience are helpful to a person in gaining objectivity and being unbiased; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the DCAD will consider an amendment to the policy at the DCAD meeting scheduled for February 8, 1989, at 7:30 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Mesquite urges the DCAD Board of Directors to amend the policy and repeal the limit of three two-year terms;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE MESQUITE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City Council of the City of Mesquite does here by urge the Board of Directors of the DCAD to amend its policy and eliminate the limitation that an ARB member may only serve three two-year terms for a total of six years.

SECTION 2. That the DCAD Board of Directors be encouraged to keep knowledgeable and experienced members of the ARB while clininating any applicants and/or ARB members who are not "objective and unbiased" regardless of their experience or lack of it.
