A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION IN THE AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$569,543.00 FOR FEDERAL FUNDS UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT AND DESIGNATING JAMES A. PRUGEL AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING REQUIRED ASSURANCES AND ACTING IN CONNECTION WITH SAID APPLICATION, AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite is entitled to certain funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of an amount not to exceed \$69,543.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds for the 1989-90 program year; and

WHEREAS, the City has conducted public hearings; and

WHEREAS, the Mesquite City Council has considered the suggestions and recommendations raised at the hearings; and

WHEREAS, it is the public interest of the citizens of the City of Mesquite that application be made for such funds.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:



SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such cases provided.



The Community Development objective of the City of Mesquite is to assume decent, viable living areas and conditions for low and moderate income residents through projects and activities which stabilize and improve low and moderate income neighborhoods by the elimination of blighting influences and through the provision of public facilities and services.

Activities proposed to be undertaken with available funds are as follows. Available funds for Grant Year 1989-90 total \$569,543.

Construction of a Senior Citizen Center at Rutherford Park. Phase One/Facility Design | \$17,935 |
| 5. | <u>Social Services Building</u>
Included fire and electrical code work, roof work, plumbing, landscaping and meeting room redesign. | \$20,000 |
| 6. | <u>Sewer Line Replacement</u>
To replace deteriorated sewer line in Crest Hill Alley; 1,030 ft. of 8-inch line from Galloway Avenue in the South Alley. | \$46,000 |
| 7. | <u>Water Line Replacement</u>
To replace deteriorated water line in Pyramid Drive; 800 ft. of 8-inch line from Edgemont Dr. to Woodcrest Dr. | \$32,000 |
