RESOLUTION NO. 22-90

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, REQUESTING THAT STATE HIGHWAY 352 BE CONSTRUCTED AS A FOUR-LANE FACILITY FOR THE ENTIRE PROJECT LENGTH FROM U.S. HIGHWAY 80 TO SOUTH OF THE UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, on June 25, 1986, tendered Minute Order No. 84669 authorizing a roadway realignment and improvement project on State Highway 352 from U.S. Highway 80 to south of the Union Pacific Railroad;

WHEREAS, said minute order specified construction of a two-lane project from U.S. Highway 80 to north of North Mesquite Creek, and a four-lane project from that point to south of the Union Pacific Railroad;

WHEREAS, the Town of Sunnyvale has requested that consideration be given to extending the planned four-lane configuration within the town limits of Sunnyvale;

WHEREAS, full development of some sixty acres of industrially zoned land along State Highway 352 and Kearney Street will create a need for improved over-the-road truck access to U.S. Highway 80;

WHEREAS, the ongoing residential development in southeast Mesquite has principal access to U.S. Highway 80 via East Glen Boulevard and State Highway 352;

WHEREAS, no additional right-of-way is required to accommodate the construction of four lanes on State Highway 352, north of North Mesquite Creek; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite has determined that it should take full advantage of State Department of Highway and Public Transportation funding for roadway improvements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION. That the City of Mesquite urges the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation reconsider terms of Minute Order No. 84669, and provide for construction of State Highway 352 as a four-lane facility on State Highway 352 for the entire project length U.S. Highway 80 to south of the Union Pacific Railroad.
