

## RESOLUTION NO. 19-91

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION IN THE AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$611,112.00 FOR FEDERAL FUNDS UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT AND DESIGNATING JAMES A. PRUGEL AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING REQUIRED ASSURANCES AND ACTING IN CONNECTION WITH SAID APPLICATION, AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite is entitled to certain funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of an amount not to exceed \$611,112.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds for the 1991-92 program year; and,

WHEREAS, the City has conducted public hearings; and,

WHEREAS, the Mesquite City Council has considered the suggestions and recommendations raised at the bearings; and,

WHEREAS, it is the public interest of the citizens of the City of Mesquite that application be made for such funds:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the 1991-92 Final Statement of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of CDBG FUNDS is hereby approved and adopted by the City of Mesquite as its official 1991-92 Community Development Block Grant Program.

SECTION 2. James A. Prugel, City Manager of the City of Mesquite, is hereby authorized to file an application for funds under the Housing and Community Development Act on behalf of the City of Mesquite, Texas, and to certify to all understandings and assurances required under Federal Management Circular 74-4; National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 respectively, Executive Orders 11063 and 11246 and such other assurances and understandings as may be required.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such



## OBJECTIVES AND PROJECTED USE OF 1991-92 CITY OF MESQUITE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Community Development objective of the City of Mesquite is to assure decent, viable living areas and conditions for low and moderate income residents through projects and activities which stabilize and improve low and moderate income neighborhoods by the elimination of blighting influences and through the provision of public facilities and services.

Activities proposed to be underatken with available funds are as follows:

Available Funds for Grant Year 1991-92 total

- \$ 69,996 Latchkey Care Program To continue providing after school care for low income latchkey children at Seabourn, Black, Shands and Hanby Elementary Schools.
- Senior Citizen Center (Rutherford Park) \$ 60,000 Construction of a Senior Citizen Center at Rutherford Park.
- Water Line Replacement To replace deteriorated water lines at the following locations:

Cresthill Drive: Galloway Avenue to Willowbrook Drive -1750 feet of 6-inch line \$ 75,337

Sandy Lane to Rose Lane - 1324 feet of 6-Daffodil Drive: inch line \$ 56,998

CDBG Administration \$ 58,000 To administer and monitor the CDBG Program assuring compliance with all related requirements, reporting and program regulations.
